

# How to Become a Certified Referee with USA Volleyball in the Old Dominion Region 2017 - 2018

All clinic training and testing requirements are completed on line through the USA Volleyball Officials Training and Education web site ([volleyballreftraining.com](http://volleyballreftraining.com) or VRT) and the USA Volleyball Academy (Academy) contained within VRT. To receive credit for completion, you must register for required clinics in Webpoint, the USAV membership registration web site, and then log in to the Academy to complete the clinic and testing requirements. Practical referee and scorer ratings will be completed at tournaments designated by the ODR Referee Chair.

## Initial Requirements for New Referees

**1. MEMBERSHIP.** Join USA Volleyball and the Old Dominion Region by registering your membership through Webpoint. Current annual dues are \$50.00. You will need a credit card to pay fees on line and your driver's license to complete on-line signatures for certain documents when registering. Register through the Old Dominion Region membership page within USA Volleyball's Webpoint Membership Management System at

Fill in all the information requested and click "Continue". If you are already a member of USA Volleyball or have a previous membership in USA Volleyball, simply go to Webpoint at <https://webpoint.usavolleyball.org> and update your membership and membership information.

**2. BACKGROUND CHECK** Submit to a background check through USA Volleyball during the registration process outlined in paragraph 1 above. Current cost is \$17.50. The background check is good for a two-year period. This requirement is waived for referees 17 years old and younger.

**3. NEW REFEREE CLINIC.** Complete the Old Dominion Region New Referee Training Clinic on line at the Academy. You must first register for the "ODR New Referee Clinic OD18\_202" in Webpoint and then go to the Academy to receive credit for completing the required courses and exams. After you have completed your membership application as outlined in paragraph 1 above, log back in to Webpoint <https://webpoint.usavolleyball.org> . Click on the blue + icon in the Region Clinics line of the Member Home menu on the left hand side of the start page in the USA Volleyball Events section to expand the Region Clinics list. Click on the "Region Ref/Score Clinics" link which will display all available clinics. Click on the "+ Participant Registration" bar to the right of the "ODR New Referee Clinic OD18\_202" line. The next screen to appear is the "Registration" screen. Individuals who have completed their registration for the current season and are "current" members should enter their member number (a seven digit number from their membership number) in the "Member / Contact ID" box and click "GO".

**Member/Contact ID:**  **GO** . For example, if your membership number is similar to OD1234567FJ17, then your "Member Number" would be the 1234567 portion of the complete member number. Otherwise, you will have to enter your information in each block marked with a red asterisk (\*) in the "Individual Information" section. After entering all of your member information, click the red "Submit" box **SUBMIT** at the bottom of the page. On the next screen, click the "Edit" box for Participant Information to correct any membership information that is missing or incorrect. Click the red "Register" box **Register** to complete the registration process. A "Registration Confirmation" window confirming successful registration will pop up. Click "OK". The next screen is the confirmation screen. On it, you will find your login information (username & password) for logging into the clinics contained at the USA Volleyball Academy. You will have the exact same user credentials (name, email address, username, & password) that you have for Webpoint. In addition to your login information, you will also see a "Login to USAV Academy" link in a red box **Login to USAV Academy** near the bottom of the page or a "USAV Academy" link **USAV Academy** in a red box at the bottom of the left hand menu section – either of which will take you directly to the USA Volleyball Academy in a logged in status to complete your clinics. When you have successfully registered for a clinic, you will receive an email confirmation from Webpoint (from [usav\\_admin@ai-group.com](mailto:usav_admin@ai-group.com)). It is recommended that you always log in to Webpoint before going to the Academy and use one of the links in Webpoint to go to the Academy. It is possible to go directly to the Academy by using the URL [www.usavolleyballacademy.org](http://www.usavolleyballacademy.org) and log in using the same login credentials you

use to log in to Webpoint. When you are on the Academy's home page, you should never register as a new user even if it's your first time completing courses & clinics within the Academy. Once you are logged in to the Academy, you will see the various clinics and individual classes you're registered for. When you click the green "GO" icon, you'll be able to start an individual course. You may stop and restart each course as many times as is necessary to complete the course. Courses play using Adobe Flash Player. If you don't have it on your computer currently, you can get it free at <http://get.adobe.com/flashplayer> . You will complete the following course elements within the New Referee Clinic:

To assist you in completing the test requirements, there is an optional curriculum you may register for. The clinic is identified as OD18\_299 ODR Practice Rules Exam Cram Session. The clinic contains practice test questions much like those that appear in the various rules exams. You will never be able to complete this clinic and the clinic will remain active the entire season.

**4. NEW SCORER CLINIC.** Complete the Old Dominion Region New Scorer Clinic on line at the Academy. Register for the "ODR New Scorer Clinic OD18\_302" in Webpoint and then go to the Academy to receive credit for completing the required courses and exams using the same procedures described above. Some courses in this clinic are repeated from the New Referee Clinic, but you will not have to repeat them. Once you have completed one of the courses in any of the curricula, you do not have to repeat the course in other curricula. You will complete the following course elements within the New Scorer Clinic:

**5. SAFESPORT TRAINING.** All officials must complete Safe Sport Training in order to officiate. Go to [www.volleyballreftraining.com/SafeSport/index.php](http://www.volleyballreftraining.com/SafeSport/index.php) . Click on "Start Training" and complete the training. When finished, you will receive a completion certificate via email and USA Volleyball will enter a record of your successful completion in your Webpoint membership record (may take up to 48 hours). SafeSport Certification will be good for a two year period and will need to be renewed every two years.

**6. USAV NATIONAL AND ADVANCEMENT CLINICS.** Attend the USA Volleyball National Clinic and the USA Volleyball Referee Advancement Clinic scheduled in the Old Dominion Region. Register for both clinics at [www.volleyballreftraining.com](http://www.volleyballreftraining.com) . Click on "Events" and select "National and Advancement Referee Clinics" to get to the National Clinic Registration area. Click on "Register or Update In-Person Registration as Guest with No USAV Code". Enter your first & last names that you used

to register your membership in Webpoint and enter your Zip Code. Click “Submit”. Enter the remainder of your personal information to include Region (OD) and your current referee & scorer ratings (No Rating). Click “Submit”. Then click the “Select” button on the left hand side of the clinic list opposite the Richmond clinic on January 7. Click “Register”. Complete the payment process. You will receive a confirmation email from “VRTinteractive” confirming your clinic registration. NOTE: Make sure you register for the clinic ODR is hosting in Richmond on January 7. The National Clinic will start at 1:00 PM and the Advancement Clinic will start at 3:30 PM in the Innsbrook Room at the Richmond Marriott Short Pump located at 4240 Dominion Boulevard in Glen Allen, VA. The cost for both clinics is \$25.00 if you pre-register before January 4, but has an additional late fee of an additional \$50.00 if you register after January 4 or at the door. We should finish by 6:00 PM.

**7. PRACTICAL RATINGS.** You must pass three practical referee ratings and two practical scorer ratings at tournaments designated by the Old Dominion Region Referee Chair. We currently plan on holding the first rating session on Saturday January 6, 2018 at the Richmond Volleyball Club in Richmond, VA and possibly at another location on the same date. You will not receive any compensation for matches during the rating process. You will receive compensation for officiating only after you’re fully certified.

**8. CERTIFICATION APPROVAL.** The final step in certification is approval of your scorer certification and approval of your referee rating by the Referee Chair. Your Provisional Certifications (referee & scorer) will be good for one year.

### **Annual Recertification Requirements**

1. Complete the ODR “Referee Recertification Clinic” for your appropriate certification level (Provisional or Regional) through the Academy.
2. Attend the USA Volleyball National Clinic held in the Old Dominion Region.
3. Maintain scorer certification.
4. Complete a national rules examination annually through the Academy.
5. Pass two practical referee ratings on two different matches during the season.
6. Referee 4 (four) single day tournaments during the season.
7. All certifications are for a one year period.

### **General Information**

We recommend when completing the clinics that you not try to finish all courses in a clinic at one sitting. You will learn more and retain more if you spread out the modules over several days. We recommend you finish all on line clinics by January 1 so you’re prepared for the rating session on January 6 and our first major tournament being held in Richmond on January 13 – 15. The USA Volleyball season generally runs from December through May with most tournaments beginning in middle January. USA Volleyball gives officials the opportunity to referee high level, competitive matches for junior volleyball (boys and girls ages 10 - 18) and adult club volleyball. The training and certification program helps officials improve their abilities and capabilities in the areas of judgment, mechanics, and match management while providing a level of consistency among referees. Referees are paid for their services at tournaments depending on the type of tournament being held, the format for the matches, and referee ratings. Some tournaments also provide housing and some tournaments reimburse officials for their travel costs. Most tournaments are held on Saturdays; a few are held on Sundays; and a few are held over two or three days on Saturday and Sunday or Saturday, Sunday, and Monday.
